Event Snapshot

When events such as the Mathematics Education Research Group of Australasia (MERGA) Annual Conference are held in Tasmania, local experts are offered the opportunity to connect with fellow researchers and academics in their fields, share research findings and cultivate collaborations that aid with progression in industry. They place Tasmania on the world stage, promoting the state's facilities, experts, and hunger for exploring the extraordinary.



MERGA 44 attracted 207 in person delegates, with 44 international delegates coming from Canada, England, New Zealand, South Africa, Hong Kong, Singapore and the United States. It was the first face-to-face conference MERGA had conducted since 2019.

The theme for the event was mathematical confluences and journeys.

Conference Legacies Teacher's Day

One of the leading challenges faced by many Australian teachers is finding ways to increase the engagement levels of their students.

For keynote speaker Professor Peter Liljedahl (Simon Fraser University, Canada), this has been his research focus and purpose for over 15 years. During his time studying math lessons in Canada, his research revealed that up to 80% of students exhibit non-thinking behavior for 100% of the time in a typical hour-long session. An alarming statistic that led Peter to form researched based and tested solutions that could be easily and effectively implemented by real-world teachers.

Peter brought this findings and research-based solutions to the conference's inaugural Teacher's Day. This initiative was dedicated to providing local Tasmanian teachers with rigorously researched ideas to help with the challenges they face and produce a platform for researchers to establish good rapport with active teachers to better understand the specific challenges they face.

Many of the teachers who attended described the information shared with them at this day as being, effective, easily applicable and relevant to the challenges they face.

"As soon as I returned to the classroom I began implementing many of the ideas presented. The students responded amazingly well to it. You could see the pressure lifted for many of them and it created a much more lively, energetic, and engaged classroom."

With this introduction made and contact details exchanged, Nathan was able to organise for Peter to return to Tasmania. Upon his return Peter will be leading workshops across the state for 80+ mathematics teachers, as well as a day with some of Tasmania's math and numeracy lead coaches responsible for implementing the state's curriculum. An incredible opportunity for the professional development of our educational professionals which would not have been possible if MERGA had not been hosted in Tasmania.



Securing the Event

A key commitment for BET is targeting significant events that align with sectors where Tasmania possesses exceptional expertise. These events offer an opportunity for Tasmania to demonstrate its capabilities and cultivates an environment for the industries to continue to grow.

Professor Greg Oates is one such individual and was the lead advocate for hosting the conference in Tasmania, he had this to say:

Feedback was highly positive, and many delegates observed they will return to Tasmania following their experiences here. The second was the famil program ran by BET early that year. These famils were hosted in north Tasmania for event stakeholders and professional conference organisers – with some involved in MERGA invited. They demonstrated the capabilities and exceptional experiences on offer in Tasmania and played a key role in securing the event.

Finally, there was the <u>Business Events Attraction Fund (BEAF)</u>. This fund allows BET to offer financial support for business events hosted in Tasmania that will leave long lasting benefits to Tasmania (which MERGA 44 qualified for)
