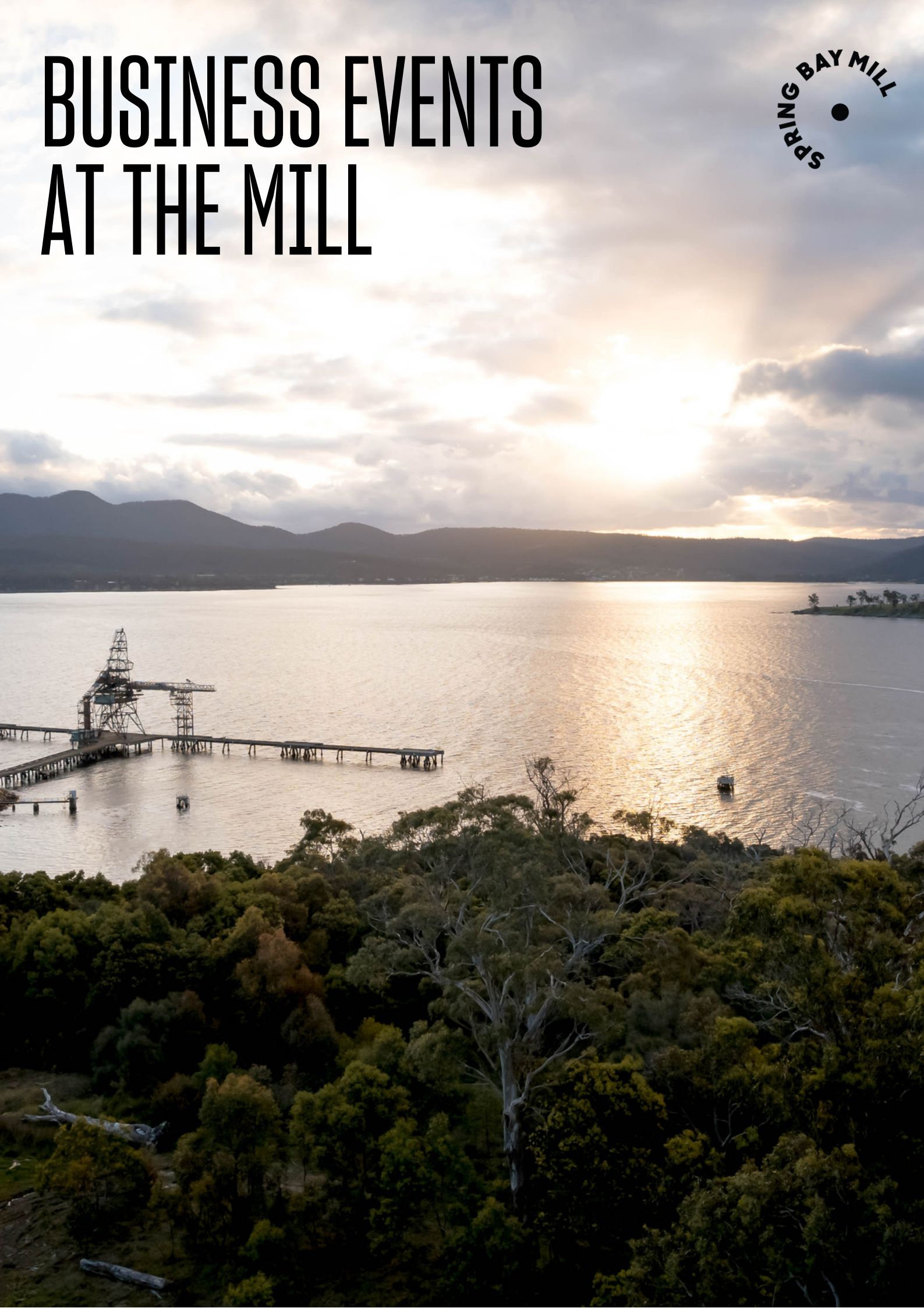

Spring Bay Mill is a sustainable events venue on the east coast of lutruwita/Tasmania. Once home to the world's largest wood chip mill, this 43ha waterfront site contrasts sweeping sea views and bush landscapes with architecturally up-cycled function spaces from the industrial past.

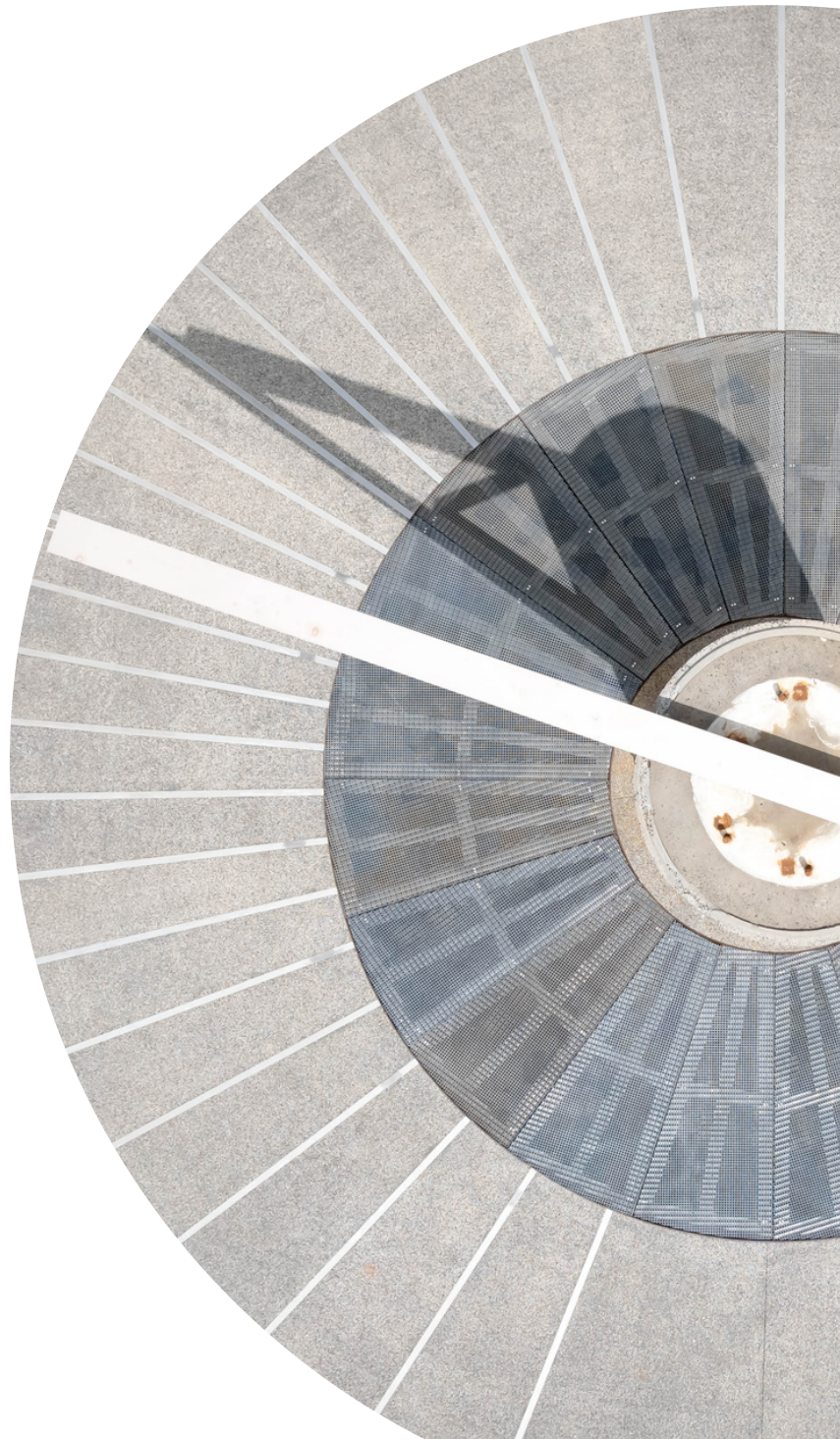

SPACES

Banksia Room

With panoramic views across the bay, the Banksia Room features a function room with adjoining commercial kitchen, a full bar, a lounge area and break-out Board Room as well as a sandstone paved courtyard with a firepit.

Tin Shed

Large rustic hall with staging, lighting and a deck with water views. The outdoor cooking area is ideal for BBQs or spit-roast feasts.

Break Out Rooms

Amphitheatre

This dramatic outdoor semi-circular structure has been up-cycled from the former slew wall that once formed part of the wood chip distribution system.

Capacity:

- Theatre: 600
- Classroom: 130
- Cabaret: 100
- Cocktail: 400

Sawtooth Terrace

Our open air canopy cover has excellent views and is situated next to the Tin Shed courtyard. Suited to BBQs and evening events.

Windlass Deck

A coastal delight with Maria Island in plain sight surrounded by Eucalypt forest and sea views from Windlass Bay.

Capacity:

- Theatre: 100
- Classroom: 40
- Cocktail: 80

Oil Change Shed

A timber lined shed space that offers a rustic feel for workshops, training and yoga classes.

Capacity:

- Theatre: 60
- Classroom: 50



ACCOMMODATION

Beach Shacks

Inspired by the traditional Tassie beach shack, these one and two bedroom eco shacks offers ideal accommodation for VIP guest speakers and event organisers, or anyone who just wants a bit more space and privacy.

Features include kitchenette, wood-burning stove and a private deck with BBQ and an outdoor bath for soaking and star gazing.



Ridge Quarters

This row of 12 single rooms, each with adjacent private bathroom, has a communal kitchen, lounge and dining/work area, offering stylish and functional accommodation.

The adjacent Ridge Suite is self-contained with two double or twin rooms, bathroom, kitchen and a living/dining area.

Glamping

The site has 40 spacious 4m and 5m tents with king, queen or twin bed configurations. Shared camp facilities include:

- Fully-equipped camp kitchen, BBQ cooktops, fridges, toasters, tableware and cooking equipment
- Sheltered dining area with a fire pit
- Self contained block of showers (indoor and outdoor) and bathrooms

Bespoke Itineraries

Story of the Mill

An immersive tour of what was once the world's largest wood chip mill. Follow the path taken by giant eucalypt trees to be processed into wood chips. Learn about the history from destruction of native forests to the present-day story of regenerating and repurposing the mill.

Tree Planting

Plant an ecosystem with our horticulture team and contribute to revegetating the land at Spring Bay Mill. This is a fun and engaging activity where guests can get their hands dirty planting, and learning about the plant species on site, unique to the East Coast of Tasmania.

Glazed and Confused Ceramic Workshop

Use ceramic techniques to create a beautiful handmade vessel. The vessels will be taken back to the Hobart studio for firing and sent directly to participants.

Salt Sommelier Experience

Dive into the world of salt, with our friends from Tasman Sea Salt. Owners Chris and Alice host a tasting of their uniquely Tasmanian sea salts paired with local ingredients.

Yoga

Experienced local yoga instructors take groups through a relaxation and stretching session. Can be arranged indoors or outdoors depending on the season.



Bush Tucker Tour

Sharing history, heritage and culture of today's palawa/pakana people and their historical connection to the Country around Spring Bay Mill.

Welcome to Country

A Welcome to Country is where an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander custodian or elder from the local region welcomes people to their land. This may be done through speech, song, dance or ceremony.

Smoking Ceremony

Following on from the Welcome to Country, a full cleansing and smoking ceremony will set the tone for your event and allow participants to develop a strong connection and appreciation for the land you are meeting on.

Maria Island Half Day & Full Day Tours

Take the ferry to wukuliwikiwina/Maria Island for a guided walk through the former penal settlement of Darlington, exploring the painted cliffs and unique landscape.

Example Itinerary

Day One

9am: Bus transfer to East Coast from Hobart.

10.30am: Arrive at the Mill for a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony by local palawa/pakana people.

11am: Morning Tea

11.30am: Session One

1pm: Buffet Lunch

2pm: Session Two

4pm: Story of the Mill. An immersive tour of what was once the world's largest woodchip Mill.

5.30: Retire to your accommodation to soak up the ambience and relax.

6pm: Dinner

Day Two

7am: Choose between a coastal walk or yoga either outdoors or indoors depending on the season.

8am: Continental Breakfast served in the Banksia Room.

9am: Transfer from Spring Bay Mill to Maria Island via Ferry. Explore the former penal settlement of Darlington and surrounds including the painted cliffs and fossil cliffs.

12pm: Enjoy a picnic lunch on the island consisting of cheese boards, fruit snacks, tea and coffee then hop on the ferry back to Triabunna at 1pm (depending on ferry times).

2pm: Session Three

4pm: Glazed and Confused. Make your own ceramic vessel during this workshop. Each will be sent back to Hobart for firing then sent directly to you.

6pm: Dinner

Day Three

8am: Continental breakfast served in the Banksia Room.

9am: Session Four

11am: Morning Tea

11.15am: Session Five

12.30pm: Tree Planting. Plant an ecosystem with our horticulture team and contribute to revegetating the land at Spring Bay Mill.

1.30pm: Picnic lunch outdoors.

2.30pm: Session Six

5pm: Bus transfer back to Hobart from Spring Bay Mill.
